Term 6
Rome wasn't
built in a day**

Topic: Romans

The children will investigate:
What is the difference between invading and immigration.
The Celts and Boudicca.
The daily lives of the Romans and we will discuss what the Roman's left Britain

Art:

The children will be designing and creating their own mosaics during their art sessions. Mrs Pratley's class will continue to work with Frank Wise School children.

French:

The children will continue learning the days of the week, numbers up to twelve and the names of some fruits to help us read "The Very Hungry Caterpillar" in French.

Numeracy:

The children will be further developing their written methods for the 4 operations, with a particular focus on multiplication and division this term. They will continue to work with fractions, solving problems and applying the to a variety of real life situations. The children will also look angles, particularly at angles which are greater than or less than a right angle. They will look at parallel, perpendicular, horizontal and vertical lines and revise the properties of 3D shapes and time.

End Product:
Creating mosaics and writing their own myth.

Music:

The children will complete their final term of specialist music teaching from Ms Webb. This will involve a variety of activities including drumming, singing and composing.

Literacy:

The children will begin the term by writing a fact file about themselves.
They will then continue to develop their letter writing skills by writing letters in a more formal style.
After the trip to Chedworth, children will investigate recount texts and write their own.
To finish the term, children will read a wide variety of myths and legends and adapt a myth.

RE:

The children will be learning some of the parables that Jesus told and questioning how we can learn from stories.

PSHE:

The children will be investigating the concept of bravery and courage. We will look at the attributes of others and design a shield that represents them.

ICT:

Email and spreadsheets.
The children will get their own email addresses this term and will learn about how to send and reply to emails. They will also create a mosaic tile using Excel.

Science:

Nutrition in animals, including humans.

We will investigate the digestion system, food groups, plan balanced diets and find out how animals get nutrients from their food.

Physical Education: Rounders, Badminton and Swimming

Both classes have Mrs Gardner (Sports Coach) to teach Rounders on a Tuesday.

Mrs Pratley's class will be taught the skills of badminton, including: how to throw a shuttlecock underarm; how to hit a shuttlecock at a target using a forehand stroke; how to serve a shuttlecock and how to produce a rally with a partner. This will then lead to the children playing small sided games of badminton.

Mr Stother's class will be swimming every Monday.
