#### **HUMANITIES OBJECTIVES**

To understand why castles were built and their uses in the past.

To know about significant places in our own locality (Warwick, Broughton and Banbury Castles)

To understand about significant historical events and that local castles had links with Civil War.

To understand the lives of significant people in the past (Queen Elizabeth I)

### OUTDOOR LEARNING

To understand how to stay safe in the local environment and beyond.

To enjoy outdoor activities and games skills.

### PE OBJECTIVES

To learn how to use a range of the equipment, how to be as steady as a rock when balancing, learn a range of jumps on and off of the equipment, travel in a variety of different ways and explore large equipment by using different points of contact.

## **RE Objectives**

Describe position, movement and direction.

### PHSE Objectives

To know about jealousy, talk about my feelings when I feel alone, lose someone or something I care about, know when I feel cared for and when I love/care for someone, understand if someone leaves me they might still love me, understand that people have to make hard choices and sometimes they have no choice. To feel proud on behalf of my friends when they have done something well and think of ways to help me feel better when I am feeling hurt without hurting others.

### SCIENCE OBJECTIVES

Explore and compare the differences between things that are living, dead, and things that have never been alive.

To recognise that different habitats support different organisms.

Identify that most living things live in habitats to which they are suited and describe how different habitats provide for the basic needs of different kinds of animals and plants, and how they depend on each other.

Describe how animals obtain their food from plants and other animals, using the idea of a simple food chain, and identify and name different sources of food.

Find out about and describe the basic needs of animals, including humans, for survival (water, food and air).

Describe the importance for humans of exercise, eating the right amounts of different types of food, and hygiene.
