Topic Plan Term 2

ICT:

Databases:

We will be looking at creating our own databases for other students to explore and use to learn about a range of topics.

Topic:

Rainforests:

In Topic we will be looking at the vast range of rainforests found all across our planet. We will look at the plants and animals that live there, and some of the dangers they face.
