Focus on Year 3

Please try to encourage these attributes at home, too.

The power of 'yet'

Three letters but this small word is a powerful tool in the classroom. Try reading the following sentences:

I can't do it.

I don't understand it.

It doesn't make sense.

Then add the word 'yet' to the end of each sentence and the message is transformed. I have even heard Year 1 children using this phrase as they engage positively with their learning. It is all part of developing a Growth Mindset and is something that we are encouraging across the school.
