WHAT IS AVAILABLE FOR MY CHILD?

Nursery for children aged 3 & 4 years

15 or 30 hours What am I entitled to ?

You can check if your child is entitled to 30 hours funding by going to the website www.childcarechoices.gov.uk

15 hours funding entitlement

Every child is entitled to 15 hours free Nursery Provision from the term after they turn 3.

At St Leonard's we provide this as either 5 x morning or 5 x afternoon sessions during term time only.

Sessions times are
8.30am- 11.30 am or
12.15pm-3.15pm
We also run lunchtime sessions from 11.30am

- 12.15pm . The cost is £5 per session .

If you require additional hours for your child, depending on availability this is available and is charged at £5 per hour or part. All additional hours must be booked in advance.

30 hours funding entitlement

If you meet criteria for 30 hours funding our general offer is as 8.30am-3.15pm Monday-Friday term times only.

Flexible hours are available subject to availability please ask at the school office or Nursery .

Our Nursery provision is open from 7.30am until 6pm. Hours over your 30 entitlement are charged at a flat rate of £5 per hour/ part of hour. Additional hours must be booked in advance

What happens in a session?

Your child will be allocated a key person. Who will oversee your child's time at sessions. They will also record your child's progress and record this in your child's learning journal. and act as your main point of contact should you have any concerns .

In line with Early Years guidance all children will have daily access to play indoors and outdoors. Suitable clothing for wet weather is provided by school. The children will have a balance of time spent initiating their own play and time spent in adult led play based activities. Group times will be led by the children's key person. Group times cover a range of learning experiences: listening and joining in with stories, rhymes and songs, sharing ideas, practical maths and music.
