



How can I continue schooling my child, if I have to self isolate?

We appreciate that, for many of us, this is a very worrying time. Many families are being asked to self-isolate and stay at home for 14 days. We are here to help you in any way that we can.

We understand parents' concerns, when their children are missing school and, in some cases, their children do not have any symptoms. The following activities can be used by the children to continue working from home and to give some structure to their day.

In the event of the school closing, then teachers will set daily tasks (Maths and English) and a weekly task, in the form of a project. This is in addition to the suggestions below.

Activities for children self-isolating:

English:

Read your reading book for 30+ minutes each day. This doesn't have to be an AR book, but it could be. You are allowed to quiz at home, during this time, and can get onto the site using this web address: <https://ukhosted36.renlearn.co.uk/2246836>

Write a letter to someone who is self-isolating (e.g. a friend, a family member, someone in a care home) to cheer them up and help them feel less lonely.

Write a report that discusses the advantages and disadvantages of closing schools because of COVID-19.
